


This EI Supersedes: E.I. 78-12 and E.I. 82-12.

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) is continuing to encourage the utilization of forest products resulting from the clearing of land for construction purposes.

This Department will continue to cooperate by notifying DEC of projects that involve the clearing of two or more hectares of forest cover containing potentially marketable forest products (sawlogs, pulpwood, firewood, etc.) The Department should also notify DEC if forest products of a significant value, type or quantity (e.g., a stand of Black Walnut trees) will be affected by our projects, regardless of the number of hectares involved.

It will continue to be the Region's responsibility to judge whether or not a proposed project will affect potentially marketable forest products.

The Regions continue to have the responsibility for notifying DEC. The reason for this is to notify DEC as soon as possible rather than waiting until PS&E. Therefore, as soon as it has been determined that a project will affect potentially marketable forest products to the extent that DEC should be notified, the Region shall continue to:

1. Notify the appropriate DEC Regional Utilization and Marketing Forester in writing. (Notification should be made as soon as the project's effects and schedule are fairly certain.)
2. Send copies of the notification to:

3. Include a brief summary in the final PS&E letter of transmittal stating whether or not there are marketable forest products on the project and, if so, whether DEC intends to promote their salvage.

There will be no additional cost associated with the implementation of this E.I.
