We have been advised by the Comptroller's Office that it is no longer necessary to supply a Certificate of Authentication when an out-of-State or Canadian Notary verifies a contractor's Labor Affidavit (Form A & C1). Future printings of Form A & C1 will contain the following revised footnote:

*\*\*If this affidavit is verified by an oath administered by a Notary Public in a foreign country other than Canada, it must be accompanied by a certificate authenticating the authority of the Notary who administered the oath.*

The aforementioned certificate may be made by the clerk or other certifying officer of a court in the district where the oath was administered, under the seal of the court; or by the clerk, register, records, or other responsible officer of the district; or by the officer having charge of the official record of the appointment of the notary, or having a record of the signature of the notary; or by a consular official of the United States resident in the country. If the same notary signs subsequent affidavits during the term of the contract, no later certificate of authentication will be required.

The 1967 edition of Form A & C1 can be utilized until existing supplies are depleted. However, if an out-of-State or Canadian notary verifies the affidavit, the old footnote should be obliterated.

This Bulletin will serve as an amendment to MURK, Subsection 1.141 (page 1-35).
