

Prior authorization from the Construction Subdivision for force account work or agreed prices under Item 900, Temporary Erosion Control, 1962 Specifications or Item 209.01, Temporary Soil Erosion and Water Pollution Control, 1973 Specifications, is no longer required.

Such authority is delegated to the Regional Construction Supervisor who should determine, with the assistance of the Main Office if necessary, whether unit bid prices or additional compensation is applicable in each instance of work in this category prior to the start of work.

Orders-on-Contract are required to increase the contract bid amounts for the above Items.

The Final Estimate shall include an accounting of how the money in the above Items was used. For example:

- A. Work @ Contract Prices
 Excavation, Item 2, 500 cu. yds. @ \$5.00/cu. yd. = \$2,500.00
- B. Work @ Agreed Price (agreed price analysis attached)
 Furnishing & Placing Hay Bales 100 @ \$1.00 ea. = \$100.00
- C. Work by Force Account (Force Account records attached)
 Furnishing and Placing Jute Mesh L.S = \$1,320.00

The documentation requirements for the agreed prices and the force account used under these items are the same as for any other work.
